The slogan "My body, my choice" is often used in the abortion debate to argue for a woman's right to choose, even at the expense of the unborn child. However, this slogan is also relevant in other contexts, particularly those related to sexual identity and end-of-life issues.

This upcoming conference seeks to present an alternative perspective that sees the body not as a matter of choice but as a gift. The Church has proclaimed this view for nearly two millennia through the celebration of the Eucharist. Christ instituted the Eucharist by saying, "This is my body, given for you" (Lk 22:19). In this way he established the gift as the paradigm for understanding the body. The Eucharistic body is a "body given for you," and our human body is governed by the same logic.

The conference intends to explore this logic from three perspectives:
1) the "body given" in response to a vocation,
2) the "body given" transforms our moral life, and
3) the "body given" is always also a social body, embedded in the Church and in society, and thus in history and tradition.
